BURIED: 4TH BATTALION PARADE GROUND CEMETERY –

The 4th Battalion, Australian Imperial Force, was drawn from New South Wales & from 25th April to June 1915 buried 34 of its dead. The cemetery is accessible only on foot & lies some 300 metres left from the road along the ridge between Lone Pine Cemetery & Courtney's Post.

There are now 116 burials in the cemetery of which all but 9 are Australian.
