MENTIONED FOR GOOD AND GALLANT CONDUCT IN CONNECTION WITH
THE RECENT HARD FIGHTING AT POZIERES IN AUGUST 1916.

KILLED IN ACTION: 05 AUGUST 1916 ON POZIERES BATTLEFIELD & THE RED CROSS
REPORT STATES THAT THE TRENCH HE WAS IN WAS BLOWN IN & HE WAS BURIED IN IT -
“MACKINLAY WAS A RUNNER”.
