**NOTE:** Newspaper report on death of father, Andrew McNamara, states that perhaps no man was better known among the early residents of Temora, who up to the date of his death was ranked as the second oldest pioneer. His prowess as a horse breaker was well known all over the south-west where he was employed as head stockman on Big Mimosa Station in employ of James Robinson.
