AGE: 30 YEARS (AS STATED) – Previously 32 YEARS 2 MONTHS.

FAMILY: Details unknown.

There is a record of a Patrick Whitty migrating to Australia in 1913.

NEXT OF KIN: PHILIP WHITTY – LICENCEE OF **TERMINUS HOTEL IN TEMORA**  
FROM 1914 to 1918.

OCCUPATION: MINER – (AS LISTED).

MEMBER: 20<sup>th</sup> BATTALION, “D”COMPANY – 5<sup>th</sup> BRIGADE.

GALLIPOLI: PROCEEDED TO JOIN THE M.E.F. ON GALLIPOLI PENINSULAR ON  
15<sup>th</sup> AUGUST 1915.

ILLNESS/WOUNDED:

LISTED AS SICK & THEN WITH A TWISTED ANKLE 15/21  
SEPTEMBER 1915 & TRANSFERRED TO HOSPITAL SHIP & ON TO  
HOSPITAL IN MALTA.

FROM MALTA IN JANUARY 1916 HE WAS TRANSFERRED TO  
HELIOPOLIS THEN TO BE RETURNED TO AUSTRALIA ex SUEZ ON  
28 JANUARY 1916 ON H.M.A.T. “KANOWNA”.

DISCHARGED: 16 JULY 1916.

FORWARDED TO PATRICK WHITTY AT 34 MANOR PARK ROAD,  
HARLESDEN, N.W. LONDON.
