

# - WILLUNDRY PROVISIONAL SCHOOL (No1) - 1893 to 1912

## Willundry Provisional School No1 1893 - 1912

The two acre site for the Willundry School was dedicated on 22nd April, 1892 on Portion 101, Parish of Wallundry County Bland. Temporary reservation of eight acres - Portion 102, was also dedicated for the school horse paddock.

A school building from Trigalong, four miles from Temora on the Cootamundra Road was authorised to be moved to the site in September, 1892.

During its time as a provisional school it was run part-time with Narraburra.

Some of the teachers who taught at this school were: Miss E Crowe, Mr Regan, Miss M Kerin, Miss A Edwards, Mr E Dash, Mr A Phillips, Mr Schumack, Mr Conroy, Mr Miller, Miss McGlenn and Miss Jackson. Family names of pupils who attended were Birmingham, Calmey, Dew, Fuller, Kook, Manning, Muir, Rapley, Rattey, Smith, Wendt, Wilson, Collins, Ross, Cutting, Saunders, Rigney, Mills, Butterworth and Noble.

## Willundry Provisional School (No 2). 1913 - 1928



Approximately 1918-1919

Nearby, a new school building was built on land resumed from Mr W Staniforth for Eight Pounds in April, 1913. This site was selected as being more central to the needs of the children in the area. This school stayed open until 28th March, 1928.

Upon its closure, the building was moved to Milvale and the remaining pupils were transferred to either Grogan or Sunnymede schools. Miss Jackson, who was the last teacher at Willundry School No 1, was the first teacher at this school.

Some of the teachers who taught at this school were Miss EM Jackson, Miss Reynolds, Miss IM Harpley, Miss McFadgen, Miss O'Donal, Miss Cameron, Miss Whelan, Mr W Ingram and Mr Keating.

Also nearby, this building was moved from the West Wyalong district to a site comprising one quarter of an acre leased from Albert Wiencke's property, "Mayfield" after the need was acknowledged for a school in the area.

The school was opened in 1938 and closed in 1974 and in that time quite a few alterations and additions were added.
