

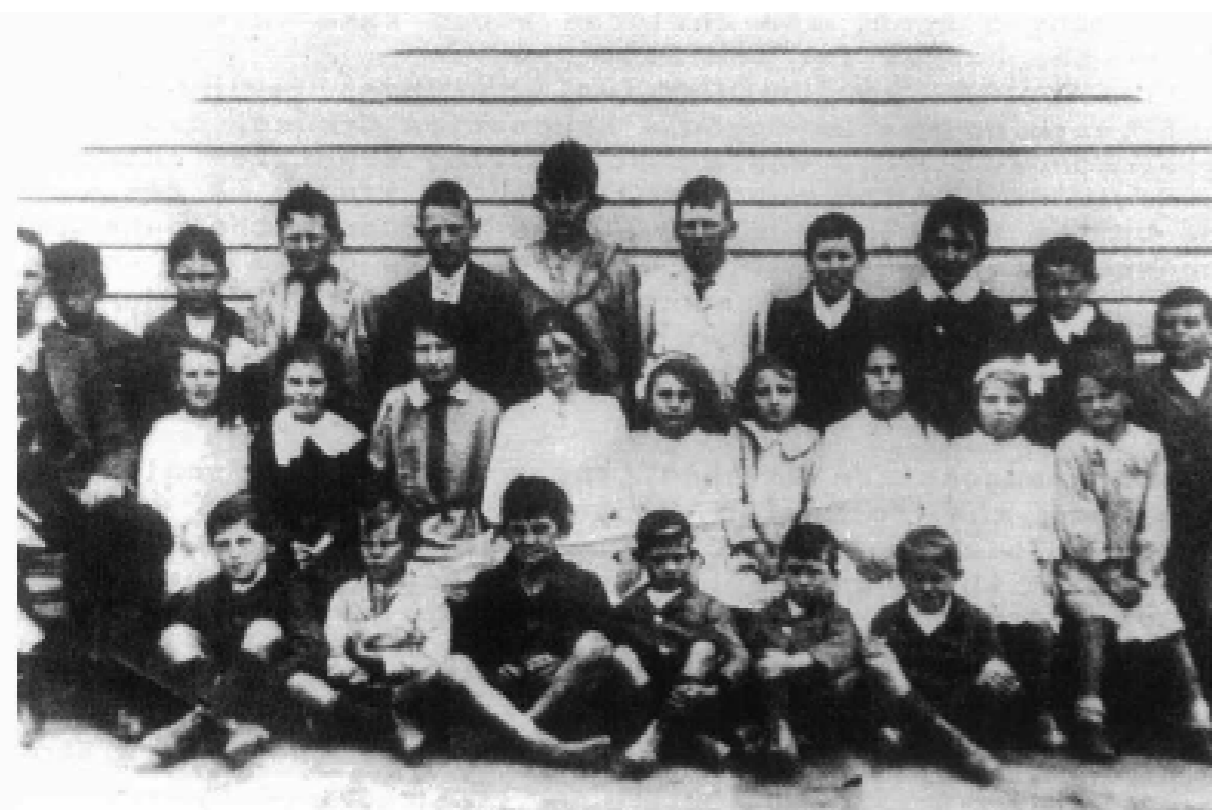
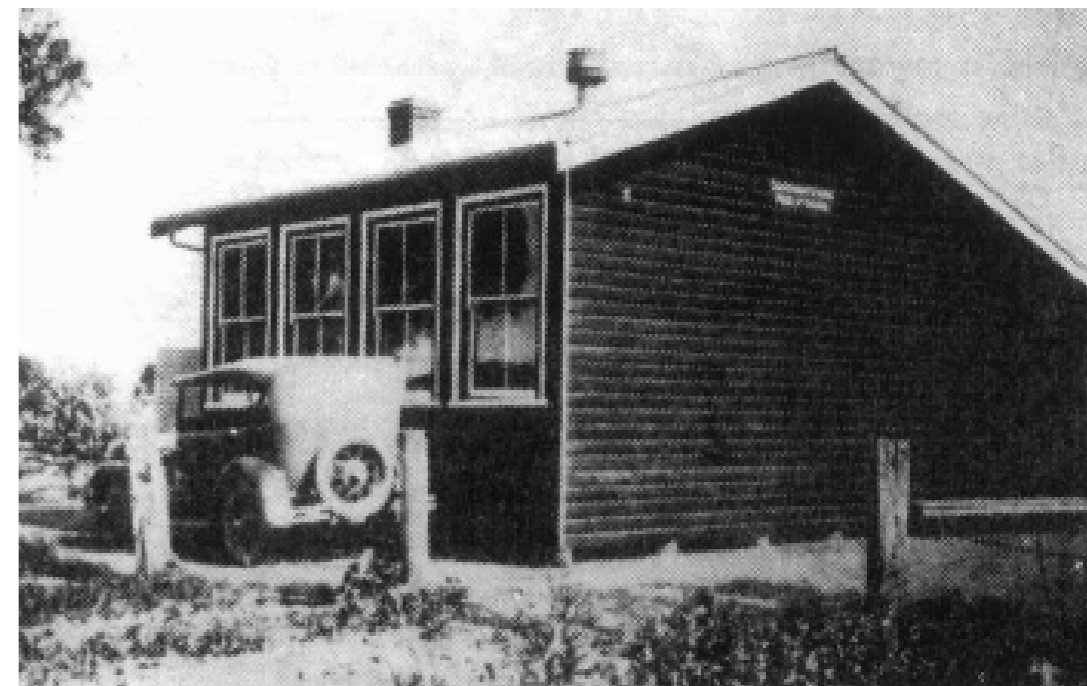
Combaning Siding School 1911-1967

The school opened as a provisional school on 23rd October, 1911, after a twelve year battle with the Education Department. The following year it became a public school and remained classified as such until its closure in December, 1967.

In the 56 years the school had the following teachers listed on the roll: Miss Eliza Hacker (Glennan), Mr Harold Haug, Mr Alfred May, Mr J Thomas, Mr Tom Fardy, Mr Nethery, Mr Shinfield, Mr Jack Otterly, Mr W Hacker, Mr Tom Ingersoll, Mr Stan Fouracre, Mr Stan Martin and Mr G Blanche.
